ITHACA COLLEGE

Course Description:

Greek Peak offers five levels of ski and snowboard instruction based on ability level:

Never Ever (Level 1) - this level is for those who have never tried skiing or snowboarding

Beginner (Level 2) - this level is for those who have skied or snowboarded before, are able to get on and off a chairlift and are comfortable on green circle (easy) trails

Intermediate (Level 3) - this level is for those who can link turns but still moderate speed and are comfortable with blue square (intermediate) trails

Advanced (Level 4) - this level is for those that ski/board with good technique on all terrain and snow conditions and are able to ski/ride black diamond trails with confidence using carved turns.

Expert/Instructor Development (Level 5) - this course is for advanced level skiers and boarders interested in teaching skiing and snowboarding. Ski & Ride School policies and procedures, progressions in learning, and teaching skills are some of the areas that will be covered.

Please select the class that best fits your ability level.

How the Course Works

The course runs for six (6) consecutive weeks on Saturdays at Greek Peak starting 1/25/2020 and ending 2/29/2020. The course includes a 5 hour pass, 1 ¼ hour lesson, and rental equipment, if needed. It is important that your schedule permits attendance on this day throughout the season.

Bus transportation is provided by the college. The bus will leave promptly at 10:00am from Phillips Hall and arrive at Greek Peak at 10:45am. The bus will depart Greek Peak at 3:45pm and return to campus at approximately 4:30pm. Please be on time for bus departures.

When you arrive at Greek Peak, you will be greeted by a Greek Peak representative who will take attendance and make announcements. All students will receive their College PE Photo ID card at their first class/session. This card must be worn on your jacket for every class as this serves as your lift ticket/rental pass. If you drive to Greek Peak, you will go to the College Program Ticket Window in the Katalima building (across from the Welcome Center), present your college ID card, and state that you are participating in the College Credit Ski/Snowboard Program to pick up your College PE Photo ID card and check in. Each week thereafter, you will go to the same window to check in to verify your attendance.

The lesson meeting spot is located next to the Alpha Slope (Beginner's Chair Lift). Please be there 10 minutes early.

The lesson times are as follows:

- Beginner Lessons are at 11:30am
- Intermediate or Advanced Lessons are at 1:30pm

Course Registration and Payment:

Students must register for the course with Ithaca College PALS and then register and pay for the course by credit card at Greek Peak by going to: <https://sales.greekpeak.net>

The cost for the course is as follows:

- Program & Bus Transportation- \$381

If you do not have your own equipment, you can choose to rent equipment as follows:

- Rental Equipment (Skis, Poles & Boots or Snowboard & Boots) \$88
- Helmet Rental \$42

Clothing:

Be sure to dress warmly. Outer clothing should be windproof and waterproof. It is better to over dress and shed additional layers than to lack the appropriate clothing.

Student Responsibility:

All students who sign up for this course are responsible for checking their University e-mail & Blackboards for messages. Communications like class cancellations will be posted here. Please check for your messages the day before and the day of your class.

Except for extenuating circumstances requiring college advisor's approval, the following must be achieved in order to receive college credit and a passing grade:

- Attend at least one of the first two scheduled lessons.
- Attend a total of four out of the six scheduled class sessions

Refund Policy:

It is the policy of Greek Peak Mountain Resort that no refund of course fees will be given for withdrawals from the course which occur after your college's DROP deadline. A consideration will be given for medical conditions/occurrences that prevent a participant from completing their ski/snowboard program.

Refund requests for withdrawal prior to the Drop Date:

Any student that drops the course prior to the College's Drop Date will be entitled to a refund of the required classes (lesson and rental fees) not taken. You must contact the College Program Coordinator at Greek Peak, Mary Gerlach: mgerlach@greekpeakmtnresort.com and turn in your photo ID pass prior to your next class. Your refund will be based on the number of classes remaining of the four required after turning in your pass. The transportation cost included in the course cost (\$120) has been paid in full to the bus company and is not refundable. A processing fee of \$10 will be deducted from the amount of your refund. All refunds will be issued as a credit back to the credit card used when paying for the class.

Refund requests for Medical Illness or Injury:

Anyone that is unable to continue the course due to illness or injury, even if after the drop date, must send a letter of request, including medical documentation of illness/injury (physician's statement or hospital report, containing diagnosis and treatment), to Mary Gerlach: mgerlach@greekpeakmtnresort.com

The refund will be a prorated portion of course fees (lesson and rental fees), based on the number of classes remaining of the four required, after turning in your pass less a \$10 processing fee. The bus transportation portion (\$120) of the course fee is non-refundable.
